IMPORTANT!

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY IF YOU ARE EXHIBITING OPEN CLASS PROJECTS.

Exhibit entries have changed to an online system called “Fair Entry.” You will need to register your items online PRIOR to the Open Class check-in on Wednesday, July 20.

ONLINE REGISTRATION:

Between July 1 & July 17 at 11:59pm.
http://YMC2022.fairentry.com

After this time you will have to enter items on July 20 at check-in. This is not ideal as you will have to wait for us to enter all items and print entry cards for you.

There are a lot of new changes in the premium book (i.e. new classes and old ones eliminated). Please read through carefully so you enter your items in the correct classes.

Premium money must be picked up no later than SUNDAY, JULY 25, unless other arrangements are made. Unclaimed money will be considered a donation to the Yellow Medicine County Fair.

HOW TO ENTER YOUR EXHIBITS:

- Go to http://YMC2022.fairentry.com
- Sign-In or create an account. (Note: This account will be good for the next few years. • If you made an account last year, please use that.)
- First time having an account?
 - Select “BEGIN REGISTRATION”
 - Click on “INDIVIDUAL”
 - Enter Information & e-mail address. (Personal info will NOT be publicly shared)
 - Continue through until you see “CONTINUE TO ENTRIES”
- Click “CONTINUE TO ENTRIES”
 - Select “ADD ANOTHER EXHIBITOR.” If there are multiple in your family, select “+ADD AN ENTRY.”
 - This will have you select your Division, Class & Lot.
 - For each exhibit you enter, you will have to select “+ADD AN ENTRY.”
 - If there are multiple people, add their entries under their name now.
- When you are done entering all entries for each person, select “CONTINUE TO PAYMENT.” (There are no fees or payments needed, but this step is needed to complete registration.)
- Agree to the Terms, then select “SUBMIT.”

You will bring your exhibits to the fairgrounds, pick up your entry tags (already made), and attach them to your projects. Once attached you will bring items over to the Pavilion building to

be judged and arranged. Items without a tag will not be judged. If you did not bring an item you registered for please return the tag to the fair board office so we can make adjustments on our end.

RULES & REGULATIONS

All open class exhibitors are welcome! No one who has a business can exhibit their products in Open Class. These rules apply to all departments unless permission has been obtained from the secretary.

The board will interpret these rules and decide all questions of fact in connection herewith. All questions in dispute or differences not covered by these rules shall be referred to the board, whose decision shall be final.

The management will take every precaution in its power for the protection of articles and livestock on exhibition, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur during their delivery, removal, and while on the grounds.

The fair board reserves the right to remove or deny any entry of any exhibit which may be determined inappropriate.

Articles can be shown only in one lot. One entry per person per lot, unless otherwise stated.

A proper entry of all articles and exhibits must be made in the entry book at the fair office before they are delivered to the superintendents. On the entry of the articles, tags will be furnished with the number, class and lot, as entered at the office. The tag is to be attached to the article to be exhibited. The duplicate entry sheet must be retained by the exhibitor until the close of the fair, and on presentation to the superintendent in charge of the department, the exhibitor may get their articles.

Nothing can be entered as special if not listed in the premium list. When articles are not deemed worthy, the judges will refuse to award a premium, whether there be competition or not in the class.

Entries must specify owner’s name and address.

Food Preservation Rules:

1. All recipes, procedures and times followed must be according to current USDA and University of MN home food preservation publications.
2. Jars should be heat-tempered glass canning jars (no colored jars). No “one trip” jars such as mayonnaise and peanut butter jars.
3. All jars should be sealed. Leave screw bands on two piece jar lids. Jelly/jam-type products should be covered with lids. No paraffin.
4. No artificial colors should be added with the exception of pickles.
5. Jelly/jam-type products must be processed in boiling water bath according to USDA/University of MN recommendations.
6. All low acid products must be processed in a pressure canner. Fruits, tomatoes and pickle products must be processed in a boiling water bath canner.
7. All containers must be labeled with a 1” x 2” label with the following information:

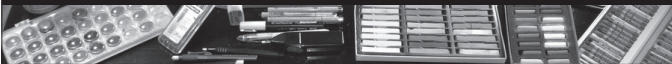

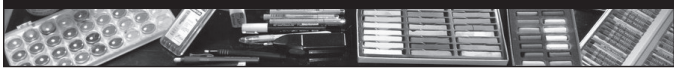

Expression in flower arranging is the creative quality in a distinctive arrangement, which reveals, to the observer, an idea, mood or story. Only one exhibit per person in each lot will be allowed. Flowers must be grown by exhibitor. Only ONE Best-of-Show Award PER PERSON. Wilted flowers may be replaced after judging. Containers will be furnished at the flower area for specimen stalks. Use no foliage below the water line.

Read your schedule well, take care to enter exhibits in the proper class. Potted and hanging plants must be in possession for at least three months. A specimen will be disqualified if it has more or less stems, sprays, stalks, blooms, etc., than the number specified in the schedule. A bud showing color is classified as a flower. Please put variety or flower name on tag; we all like to know the names of flowers we see.

Specimens should be clean, free of insect damage, with an attractive amount of foliage left attached. Remove all foliage below water line.

Roses should be shown with at least three, five and/or seven leaflet leaves above water line. Dahlias should have all but the 2 top pairs of leaf brackets removed. Stem length should be 24" to 30". Re-cut stems under water.

Prop specimen SECURELY straight in the bottle. Allow yourself plenty of time to set up your exhibits. Flowers and foliage for arrangements keep best if hardened in deep water overnight. Cut all specimen stems long enough to present a good appearance in the bottle. Points are usually taken off for specimens with too short of stems.
